2014 was a challenging year as we needed to choose different chemistry analyzers because of the manufacturer's



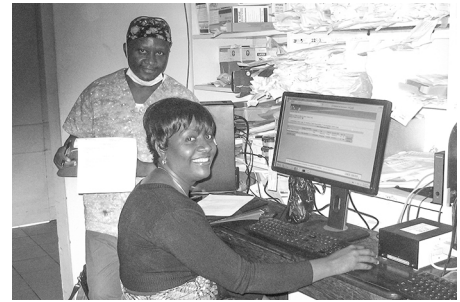

Installations of Worldwide Lab Software Solutions (WWLSS) continue in multiple missions around the world. After observing the need for such a system in mission hospitals while assisting their laboratories, Ed began to verbalize a dream of developing a laboratory computerization program to address that need. As several generous donors provided funding, Ed and Terry Coleman began years of detailed work with a software company on design and development. More recently, God brought Tom Lohrmann, an amazing man with the skills needed to move forward with the project, to continue development and provide support to those using the software.

What began as a process to computerize the laboratory grew into a basic Hospital Information and Clinical Informatics System designed to enhance patient care and streamline work processes and information flow throughout the mission healthcare facility. The system can be installed in any developing country that has internet access with adequate speed required for upgrade and maintenance of the system. It will function in a small outpatient clinic as well as a larger hospital. There is the capacity for multi-lingual translation for facilities where English is not the predominant language.

It has been a great privilege to partner with PAACS (Pan-African Academy of Christian Surgeons) to develop a module customized for their unique needs and to install it in all of their program hospitals. Several other hospitals are using the full version of WWLSS, with more projects in the definition stage.

We are excited to see God bringing more people to us with the experience needed to do the site visits and field training as we are receiving more requests for assistance!

Whether it be software or lab equipment and supplies, what a privilege it is for us to help strengthen the impact of the many ministries we assist! We can hardly believe that 20 years has passed since in 1995 we began this divine adventure that God had planned for us.
