This note from a missionary physician at Galmi Hospital in Niger perfectly expresses why WWLAB exists: to come alongside those serving in medical evangelism through mission hospitals and clinics to do whatever we can to provide assistance and encouragement.

We continue to **celebrate** the privilege of this ministry and **God’s faithfulness** as we respond to their requests. We are grateful for your continuing support as you pray for us and share your time and financial resources as part of **God’s provision** for this work. It is our joy to highlight in this issue some of **His gifts** we have experienced in the past year.

We are so thankful for each person that God has led to be part of the work here as **He continues to provide** people who are perfectly suited to the tasks. Together, we cover the many diverse activities necessary to provide the needed services. In 2013 over 400 packages of supplies and equipment were ordered or refurbished, organized, packed and shipped or carried by travelers to more than 100 hospitals, clinics and short-term teams in 49 countries. We are thankful for the blessing of God’s protection of Ed Bos, James Borody and John Brashler (and their baggage!) as they traveled thousands of miles to provide installation and training services in Cameroon, Republic of Congo, Democratic Republic of Congo, Gabon, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Kenya, Malawi and Zambia. Another exciting milestone has been the implementation of Worldwide Lab Software Solutions (WWLSS). The need for such a system has been defined over the last 19 years as our staff observed the inefficiencies and challenges of current communication with manual paper systems. Addressing this need has been an ongoing effort for over 10 years as God provided highly skilled volunteers to complete the huge task initially funded by several directed donations. WWLSS is a simple Hospital Management System that can be installed in developing country settings to manage the facility and at the same time solve many communication problems and make available various statistical reports. We are thrilled to see a growing number of marks in the Software column on the chart on the following pages!

A unique delight in this regard has been developing, installing and training staff in the use of a customized version of the software for PAACS (Pan-African Academy of Christian Surgeons) programs in various locations in Africa. PAACS is a tremendous ministry which trains national surgeons and it is an honor to partner with them in this ongoing effort.

Early 2014 brought **great rejoicing** as James and Cindy Borody received the approval notice for their visa renewal through June 2016 which allows them to continue their work with us!! We trust that you will continue to pray for all of us here at WWLAB as we respond in obedience to God’s plan – individually and together in ministry.
